(b) Effective Date.—

- (1) IN GENERAL.—The amendments made by this section shall take effect on the October 1, 2026, and shall apply to payments under subpart 2 of part B of title IV of the Social Security Act for calendar quarters beginning on or after such date.
- (2) Delay permitted if state legislation requirements before the 1st day of the additional requirements before the 1st day of the 1st calendar quarter beginning after the first regular session of the State legislature that begins after the date of the enactment of this Act. For purposes of the preceding sentence, if the State has a 2-year legislative session,

- 1 each year of the session is deemed to be a separate
- 2 regular session of the State legislature.
