To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to establish a pilot program to hire transitioning servicemembers to be Border Patrol agents.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Border Pa-
- 5 trol Training Act".
- 6 SEC. 2. BORDER PATROL SKILLBRIDGE PILOT PROGRAM.
- 7 (a) Establishment.—Not later than 180 days after
- 8 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Secretary of

- 1 Homeland Security, in collaboration with the Secretary of
- 2 Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall estab-
- 3 lish an interdepartmental pilot program through which the
- 4 Department of Homeland Security shall use the Depart-
- 5 ment of Defense SkillBridge Program to train and hire
- 6 transitioning servicemembers as Border Patrol agents for
- 7 U.S. Customs and Border Protection.
- 8 (b) Employment Skills Training.—In carrying
- 9 out the pilot program established pursuant to subsection
- 10 (a), the Secretary of Homeland Security, in collaboration
- 11 with the Secretary of Defense, shall use the authorities
- 12 available under section 1143 of title 10, United States
- 13 Code, to train and facilitate the transition of members of
- 14 the armed forces to service as Border Patrol agents.

15 SEC. 3. ANNUAL REPORTS.

- Not later than 1 year after the pilot program is estab-
- 17 lished pursuant to section 2(a), and annually thereafter
- 18 until the date referred to in section 4, the Secretary of
- 19 Homeland Security, in consultation with the Secretary of
- 20 Defense and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, shall sub-
- 21 mit a report to the Committee on Homeland Security and
- 22 Governmental Affairs of the Senate, the Committee on
- 23 Armed Services of the Senate, the Committee on Veterans'
- 24 Affairs of the Senate, the Committee on Homeland Secu-
- 25 rity of the House of Representatives, the Committee on

1	Armed Services of the House of Representatives, and the
2	Committee on Veterans' Affairs of the House of Rep-
3	resentatives that includes for the reporting period—
4	(1) the number of participants in the pilot pro-
5	gram;
6	(2) the number of eligible participants who ap-
7	plied to be part of the pilot program; and
8	(3) the number of pilot program participants
9	who are—
10	(A) members the Armed Forces;
11	(B) reserve members of the Armed Forces;
12	(C) commissioned officers or non-commis-
13	sioned officers;
14	(D) enlisted members of the Armed
15	Forces;
16	(E) veterans;
17	(F) spouses of such members of the Armed
18	Forces or veterans; and
19	(G) dependents of such members of the
20	Armed Forces or veterans.
21	SEC. 4. SUNSET DATE.
22	The pilot program established pursuant to section 2
23	shall be terminated on the date that is 5 years after the
24	date on which such program is established.
